

# ACCESSIBLE CONSENT FORMS FOR RESEARCH PARTICIPATION

## What does a consent form need?

### Invitation

- Why do you want people to participate in your research?

### Purpose of the Research

- Why are you researching your topic and do you hope to get out of it?
- Who are you targeting?

### Description of the Participation

- What will the participant do and learn?
- Will they receive feedback?

### Informing that Participation is Voluntary

- Let the participants know that their decision to not participate or to withdraw from the project will have no negative effects on their participation in future research opportunities.

### Confidentiality

- Let participants know their confidentiality will be ensured.
- Identifying information will be stored separately from the data and will not be pushed at the end of your research.

### Risks

- Some personal information may be shared with new individuals, and they do not need to share anything that makes them uncomfortable.
- Shared information may be gained by outsiders, but all efforts will be taken to ensure the shared information is kept PRIVATE.

### Potential Benefits & Compensation

- Participants can benefit from their learning engagement in the research and benefit other individuals in the future.
- Will your participants earn money from completing in your research project?

### Questions & Contact Information

- Do they have any questions about the research project? If they do, who should they contact? Provide a name, phone number, and email.

### Checklist of the Content of the Form

- Provide a checklist to ensure the participants is aware of their participation, what the expectations are, and their rights as a participant.
- Will the research be taking photos of participants? If so, you need to ask permission first!

How do you make consent forms accessible?

- 1 Use familiar images (i.e. PECS) and make sure it conveys clearly with the context



## What's PECS?

The Picture Exchange Communication System (PECS) is an augmentative and alternative communication system

- 2 Have a lot of white space on the page

- 3 Implement ADA compliances (font size = 16, font = Ariel)



- 4 Have concise information. Less words are better!

- 5 **Bold** important words

- 6 Encourage to receive feedback to ensure the content is clear



- 7 Be consistent and have simplicity in the design
